1. INTRODUCTION

- 1. To measure the level of satisfaction among the students regarding the teaching and learning procedure in the college.
- 2. To determine the level of satisfaction of students regarding the faculty and their approach towards teaching and expertise in their respective subjects.
- 3. To evaluate the transparency and effectiveness of the assessment and evaluation methods used by the college to gauge student performance and progress.
- 4. To determine the level of satisfaction of students regarding the availability and accessibility of academic support services, such as mentorship, and overall growth of the student.






2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?


3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?
















13. Do the Teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges?


14. Are the Teachers been able to identify your weakness and help you to overcome them?






18. Are efforts been made by the institution/teachers to inculcate soft skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work?



5. ANNEXURE

Action Taken from the SSS of the previous year and the observation and suggestion given by students in the present survey.

In the annual student satisfaction survey conducted by the IQAC, the students are asked to identify and give three observations/suggestions to improve the overall teaching-learning experience in the institution. The analysis has been carried out by aggregating the most occurring suggestions in the student responses. This would provide an idea of the most general expectations, observations, and suggestions from the students. As identified in the SSS of Nar Bahadur Bhandari Government College, Tadong for the academic year 2021-22, a majority of the students had suggested the college to make an improvement in the use of ICT tools. The college has taken up this issue seriously and has worked on this aspect with utmost priority. High speed internet has been added in the academic blocks, all the departments have been provided with new projectors, college library has provided the accession to e-resources and the conduct of classes/assignment presentation has been prioritized in the blended mode.

Similar suggestions have been received in this present SSS for the academic year 2022-23. Most of the suggestions, as received indicate a few functional improvements at the administrative level, methods of curriculum delivery, conduct of workshops for mental well-being, excursions, field-trips/ internships and add on learning opportunities for employability skills. Selected suggestions from students of NBBGC, Tadong are presented below:

- Teachers should make students more interactive in class and should cover the syllabus as soon as possible.
- 2) I would like to suggest that teacher should take classes regularly so that the syllabus are completed in time and we need not to face problems in the end of the session as sometime in the end to finish the syllabus they tends to hurry.
- 3) "Placement facilities, internship"
- 4) "Some teachers just sends the notes and doesn't discus them in the class also ...it seems some teachers doesn't cover all the syllabus coz last time in the end term examination the question were very new which weren't discussed in the class, else our teachers are the best.
- 5) I think the way of teaching is quite old, it would be better if there were more practical sessions and outdoor learnings instead of solely focusing on theoretical learning. There are practical classes but they aren't really useful for our upcoming futures, since chemistry basically requires practical learning, it would be better if we are taught more about the things or stuffs in practical way.
- 6) "Supply of sufficient infrastructure to the classes and availability of sufficient chemicals and instruments in the labs.
- Tourism student can be taught practically duration of 1 year and theoretical can be teach 2 year in BA course.

- 7) Tourism student can be taught practically duration of 1 year and theoretical can be teach 2 year in BA course.
- 8) I think Experimental studies should be there in our institute and overall teaching process is good.
- 9) As a physical education student, B.PED and M. Ped should be started very soon as it's just a waste of time for us to complete our BA here and then go further for B. Ped and M. Ped taking the total time of the course up to 7 years.
- 10) Coordination between staff and students
- 11) Overall, the teaching method is well but it would be better if there would be speakers in classroom so that back bench student can also hear the lectures properly.
- 12) Since it's my last semester I don't have any bad comments, I appreciate my teacher's hard work but what I honestly felt is there should be some refreshment activities for students which can help students to get a better bond with teachers and classmates too. Education should not be limited up to learning and teachers should focus on building a good relationship with students too. Overall, this institution is fine there should be more extra-curricular activities related with class topics.
- 13) More outdoor learning activities should be encouraged such as taking out students for field trips.
- 14) "Practical assignment rather than in file it should gain some knowledge and experience. Most of the assignments are done in file and that too will be copied. If it's done in field visit survey then it would be better. Talking about Commerce if they tell us to form a business model for sessional then it would be helpful for students rather than just writing exams. Students will forget what they have learned for exams but yes if it about the real project about the business or finance relating to sale or marketing then I bet they will never forget and also their experience will help them in future.
- 15) Accommodation should be expanded.
